Sad News to Report on the Passing of Brother David Bobzien



It is with a very heavy heart that we inform every one of the passing of Brother David (Dave) Bobzien on December 30th. David's wife Cathy was with him and his passing was peaceful. The Bobziens have two grown sons: David, Jr and Brendan.

David was a charter member of the Colonel Thomas J. Cunningham, Jr. Division of the AOH and a long-time friend to his fellow AOH brothers. He was very active in the organization and early activities of the COL Cunningham Division.

David's life was dedicated to his family, his faith and service to others through his chosen profession of the law. David attended Holy Cross University, graduating in 1968 with a bachelor of arts in political science, and the University of Virginia Law School, graduating in 1971. From 1971 to 1975, David served in the U.S. Army as a Captain in the Judge Advocate General's Corps. While in the Army, David earned a Master of Laws in taxation from The George Washington University. After leaving the Army, David entered private practice at the law firm of Fitzgerald and Smith. He left private practice in 1979, becoming Assistant Counsel in the Office of Professional Responsibility of the United States Department of Justice. David was hired as Fairfax County Attorney by the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors on December 15, 1992, and severed in that position from 1993 to 2016. Following retirement as Fairfax County Attorney he joined the McCammon Group a legal firm which serves the mediation, arbitration, judge *pro tempore*, and special master needs of lawyers and litigants throughout the Commonwealth and beyond.

David was a Past President of the Virginia State Bar, the Local Government Attorneys of Virginia, the Virginia Law Foundation, and the Fairfax Law Foundation. He also served as a Virginia State Bar Delegate to the American Bar Association's House of Delegates and as Chairman of the Virginia CLE committee of the Virginia Law Foundation.

David and Cathy joined with the COL Cunningham Division for the 2016 Division Trip to Ireland having a great time on the tour. David even talked our bus driver into making a slight detour, so he could visit an ancestral home town. Despite recent health issues, both David and Cathy were looking forward to the upcoming trip in September of 2019.

David was a good man, a good Catholic, and a good friend. He will be remembered by all of his AOH brothers as a man who lived our moto; Friendship, Unity, and Christian Charity. There is no greater an epithet that a man could have.

He will be missed by all. We give our condolences to his family and friends and pray for his soul.

Eternal rest grant unto him Oh Lord and may Your perpetual light be made to shine upon him. May he rest in peace.

AOH Jackets, Shirts, Sashes and Name Badges

As in most organizations, there is AOH specific attire. If you are new to the Division or if you have just never gotten around to getting one of our great COL Cunningham Division Shirts, or one of those Kelly-Green Sport Coats, this information is for you.

Wearing of the Green (When and what to wear):

For semi-formal/formal occasions, the AOH "uniform" is green sport coat, tri-Color sash, white shirt, Irish theme tie, black trousers and optional ball cap. These occasions include AOH State and National conventions, Masses, funerals, AOH dinners, parades, and other public events. The jackets are also appropriate at all Division meetings and events.

For **informal events** (i.e. Raffle ticket sales, Parish events, Division outings (ball games, picnics, meetings, etc.) the Division logo polo or sweatshirts (optional ball cap) are appropriate. Many brothers have already ordered the division polo and sweat shirts.

Cunningham Division Attire:

Name Badges:

The Division name badges can be order directly from President Cole Slattery at any meeting or by email. President Slattery's email is on the last page of the edition of the Chronicles. If you are a new member to the Cunningham Division your name is automatically added to the next order of badges.

Name badges should be worn at all Division and AOH events, and when selling raffle tickets. You don't need to be wearing a Division polo shirt or green jacket to wear a name badge. The badge has your name and identifies you as a member of the Colonel Cunningham Division of the Ancient Order of Hibernians.
